This is the third year this program is being held having begun in 2009 as a public movement on the sidelines of International environ-mental summit held in Co-nenhagen to request world found in atmosphere leading to global warming posing threat to safe life condi-tions. What used to be around

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what used to be around 280 ppm during the pre-in-dustrial era, the present car-bon content in the atmo-sphere had shot up to 390. It was therefore urgent that this condition had to be re-versed to a tolerable level of

versed to a tolerable level of 350 ppm suggested by the world scientific community, Arun said. We need to get off fossil fuels right away, and move to a sustainable, democrati-cally controlled, and renew-ably-powered future as soon as possible, " he said.

We served dinner and sweets to all the children.



Alissa Nathaniel from Australia, came to Tiru this year and did a fund raising concert for Shanti children project, that was a wonderful live music program, on 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2012 she released her Jazz Kirtan CD called "Sacred Soul" that was super, she is a great singer, more than 150 people came to the concert and made a nice donation for our project, thanks to Alissa and her partner Jnanadev for organizing this great event. For the last two years, we wanted to go for the turtle walk, finally this year it happened, our friend Mr.Arun has been volunteering and conducting the Turtle walk for many years, last month he came to Shanti tuition centre and showed the slide show about the turtle walk. Immediately, all our tuition children wanted to go and experience the turtle walk. The Students Sea Turtle Conservation Network is a volunteer group trying to conserve sea turtles and create awareness about endangered species <u>www.sstcn.org</u>.

On the 12th Feb. 2012, we took our tuition children on a bus to Chennai. Walked about 7 kilometer at the beach in the night time and found more than 250 turtle egg and relocate them in a safe place, it will be a better chance of hatching and making it back to their home in the sea. It was an amazing experience for all of us, walking on the ocean in the moon light, saw many fish, crab, few dead turtle, lobsters, etc., thanks to dear Arun.



As usual we are going to teach the 10th class students basic computer class in their summer holidays, the students are looking forward to their computer lessons. More than 10 students will participate and get benefit from our computer classes, which will help them with their further studies, communication skills and general computer knowledge.
